They are trying to get 2 years
Drill in 3 months in to us
i can tell you they dont
halt but us though it we
went to Dovercourt last
Sunday and had a bath
in the sea we went to
Dovercourt last Wednesday
and was vaccinated and
went to day for a warm
bath my arm just beginning
to itch we got done much to
day as it been raining all
the morning but it cleared
up this afternoon

it a nice place even it
rains i can tell you we
been learning Saluting Drill
this last day or two and got
pays for walking out

Dear wife will you send
my Raynor and I having
stick please we got paid
to night 4 shilling they have
not allowed me for a long
yet now we got to buy our
own boot Polish for cleaning
traps and rags its a job to
get hold of any rag here

We get very decent food
some times but atill i get
enough but the Pickits are
a bit hard i can you
did you get my Cloths
alright have you heard
about your allowance yet
~~give my love to Mather~~
and tell her i am getting on
alright at present i will
write to her when i have time
how did E. Elms get on over his
appeal now i must inclose with
best of love yours loving
