Afternoon but we had shifted
away in the Morning so he did
not see worst luck he has been
Working about two miles

away from where I have been
bilitated since I have been in France
and I did not know or I might have
gone and seen him I have had

Platoon B. & I France Well love
we are ^{out} for a Divisional Training
for 6 weeks I hear but I hope
the War will be over before
then but I afraid it wont well.
my loved had a letter from father
last week he says he is coming
out here as Foreman on the Railway
pulling Roads down he going to
get one I killing a hour and be
in Circus the Army find him
food and Lodging and Boots and
under wear at Cost price and work
not less than 54 hours a week
he said he had a letter from you
and he said you had been in the
War lately Well love I must close
my letter with the best of love
and Kisses from your loving
